



Steps to Start a CarePartners Program

CarePartners is a nonprofit organization that relies on the generosity of our partners, volunteers and donors to help us provide no cost programs to caregivers and their loved ones suffering from Alzheimer's, dementia or other challenges of aging.

CarePartners is looking for congregations of faith, worship centers, nonprofit organizations and corporations to host a CarePartners program. Programs include; Gathering Place, Second Family, Common Ground, Caregiver Conference and Corporate Caregiver Workshops.

Our partners provide space, volunteers, resources and optional financial support. We look forward to exploring new partnerships to help better serve caregivers and their loved ones with memory loss; Alzheimer's, dementia and other challenges of aging.

Steps:

- 1. Leadership:** Identify a contact within your congregation/organization/company that will work with CarePartners to begin the process of starting a CarePartners program.
- 2. Volunteers:** Determine if your congregation/organization/company has adequate volunteers to help provide support.

Average Volunteers Needed per CarePartners Program:

Gathering Place—	15-30 volunteers
Second Family—	6-10 volunteers (work in pairs)
Common Ground—	2 volunteers
Caregiver Conference—	8-10 volunteers

All volunteers must go through a screening process in order to volunteer for CarePartners.



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Steps cont.:

3. **Space:** Identify space within your congregation/organization/company that is adequate to host the following program:

Gathering Place—1 large room to hold up to 30, tables for lunch, chairs for exercise, entertainment area

Second Family— small room for volunteer meeting

Common Ground—1 medium/small room to hold up to 20

Caregiver Conference— 1 large room to hold up to 150-200, 6-8 small rooms to hold up to 20-25

4. **Financial Support:** The host site is responsible for the cost of the entertainment, food and crafts. Estimate your budget per year. Some programs cost nothing to a host site, if all program pieces are donated such as food, crafts and entertainment monthly or you can plan to spend between \$1,500-\$4,000 per year.

* CarePartners welcomes (optional) financial support from our partnering congregations. Support opportunities may include outreach grants, offerings, or budgeted gifts directly to CarePartners.

5. **Caregivers/Care Partners:** Begin to identify caregivers in your area and those living with memory loss or other challenges of aging that would benefit from a CarePartners program.



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Steps cont.:

6. **CarePartners:** A CarePartners Coordinator is assigned to each partner site and program. CP (CarePartners) Coordinators provide volunteer support, education, training and on-going resources that enables all volunteers to provide the best quality care for our caregivers and care partners (individual living with memory loss or other challenge of aging) participating in a CP program.

A CP Coordinator is present for all Gathering Place and Caregiver Conference programs.
